Where we are now?

Our Stewards of the Gospel have now completed their six training days. Around 100 people took part in each one.

These lay people are being trained so that they can fulfil the role Bishop Alan has asked them to do for us all. The subjects that have been covered are:

- * The canonical role of the parish priest
- * Moving from the questionnaire to a parish plan for evangelisation
- * Practical evangelisation & how to become effective evangelisers
- * The parish & diocese in canon & civil law
- * Consultation, reactive and proactive decision making
- * The experience of the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle 'Forward together in Hope'
- Who is my neighbour? Sharing resources & skill sets
- * Supporting volunteers


The Stewards, in the majority of our parishes, are completing their questionnaires in consultation with their parish priest and the parish community. Much good has come from the process already. Parishioners are taking a good look at what is happening in the parish, celebrating the good things and looking at how to improve others. Parishes are in different stages of the process, some are nearing completion and some are just beginning. This doesn't matter: what matters is the process and taking part in the development of the future of our diocese. A deadline of Easter 2017 has been set to allow more time for those who need it.

There is a meeting in February for all the Stewards and clergy to come together to discuss the way forward. By going through this process, by working together and by the **Grace of God**, we can make the words of our Stewards of the Gospel prayer a reality across Essex and East London.

Some words from Bishop Alan



"It is 'our diocese' not 'my diocese'."

"We have to steer a course forward together for our common future and I would much rather do it in dialogue with people than present it as a fait accompli.

Hence I want to invite people to discern, together and with me, a way of going forward as Catholic Christians.

That discernment involves respectful listening, sharing information, being in tune with the Issues and needs of our community and a willingness to be open to God's will."

Bishop Alan Williams has invited lay people within the Diocese of Brentwood to put themselves forward to play an

important role in shaping its future. Called 'Stewards of the Gospel', these volunteers have been using their talents to work closely with clergy, parishes and schools as part of the diocesan planning process.

Appointed in each parish, the Stewards are, with local clergy and parishioners, assessing their parishes and collaborating with neighbouring parishes to determine opportunities for evangelisation and sacramental provision. They are encouraging discussion and being an advocate for their fellow parishioners, communicating their ideas, thoughts and concerns to the Diocesan Strategic Planning Group.

The key tasks for the Stewards of the Gospel are:

- ♦ To examine their own parish, to find out what is going on and to pave the way for a plan for better evangelisation in and by the parish.
- ◆ To begin to discern "which parish belongs to which" when it comes to working together in future.
- ♦ To be a source of creative inspiration, looking for new ways to evangelise.
- ♦ To be the voice of the laity when it comes to discerning the principles and priorities on which future plans will be based.
- ◆ To be the voice of the laity when it comes to implementing the agreed principles in the particular local situation of their own parishes.

Moving forward together

Imagine how

your parish will look in 10 years' time if we continue as we are. We will have fewer priests, the changing social situations and altered demographics will have an impact. With greater lay involvement, and a change in the way parishes operate we can paint a better picture. Together

we have to find a better way forward and we have to
evangelise to ensure we have people in our
parishes. We need more joy in our parishes to
welcome those who are seeking Christ. We need to
seek out the lost, the lonely and the lapsed. We can
all pull our resources together and go from
maintenance to Mission, with Christ at
our side. We need your prayers, your wisdom and
your help.



What can we do now?

- ⇒ Pray for our diocese throughout the process and for our future
- ⇒ Complete, after praying and thinking about it, the questionnaire insert (if your parish has chosen to insert one) with your suggestions and hand it to your parish priest or Steward of the Gospel
- Talk to your Steward of the Gospel about your hopes and concerns
- Attend meetings in your parish which your Steward is organising
- ⇒ Discuss partnerships with your neighbouring parishes and leadership within your parish

We believe that God's desire for our diocese is that every Catholic will be part of a viable and flourishing community in order for their own faith to grow and so that they can share it with others. For that to happen each of us needs to look urgently at how we can move forward together with hope.
